## CITIZENS CHARTER

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### **Preface**

While presenting the Citizens Charter of Maharashtra Maritime Board the necessary that the Citizens should know the information of the different Departments, the Composition of different Department & their Work and the Facilities provided by these Departments, the Acts which are being implemented by these Departments are included.

Maharashtra has the coastal line of 720 kms. Brihanmumbai 114 kms., Thane 127 kms., Raigad 122kms., Ratnagiri 237kms., & Sindhudurg 120 kms., such is extension of the coastline. There are 48 Minor Port attached to the Costal line, in that Ratnagiri & Reddy, these two Ports are Medium size Ports. The rivers & creeks flowing near to the shore merge into the Sea Shore. This region is also extremely remote and difficult for transportation to reach the land, for which requirement to reach these places are fulfilled by the Costal line. Till the year 1960, there was no separate Port organization and the management of the Ports was handed over by the State Government to the Department of the Central Government on agency basis. Thereafter in view of the public demand the State Government took the decision to make a separate Department under the control of Port Development Officer for development of Ports in the State and from 1<sup>st</sup> April 1963 for this purpose a separate Office was established under the then Building & communication Department of the State Government. The establishment of this Port Organization by the Government of Maharashtra has been made in view of the development and further development of Ports & to solve the issue of Communication, & after improved recovering of levies and to implement the different provision of rules of operation of boats etc.

In order to bring orderliness in the management of Port Organization, the Government vide orders dated 31/08/1990 from 30<sup>th</sup> June 1990, created the post of head of the Ports Department by designation Transport Commissioner under the Officer of the All Indian Administrative service cadre and the offices of (1) Chief Ports Officer, (2) Hydrographer (3) Marine Engineer & Chief Surveyor were brought under his control.

For accelerating the Industrial and Economic Development the State Government has declared the Maharashtra Maritime Board under Ordinance 1996 as the Apex Institution of Maharashtra Maritime Board dated 4<sup>th</sup> October 1996 and Vide G.R. No. EPT- 1096/CR 133/Tr. Dated 22<sup>nd</sup> November 1996, the Maharashtra Maritime Board has started functioning. In all there are 13 member of Maharashtra Maritime Board, in that the Hon. Minister (Ports) is the Ex-officio Chairman. Amongst the other members are 5 secretaries, 1 the representatives of Indian Navy and the Member Secretary are included. In addition to this in order to get professionally qualified expert persons to the Board, related to the water Navigation/ Port work/ Management and for Financial Issues etc., such experts are in Non- Official Members. After establishment of the Board as Maharashtra Maritime Board the other offices of water Transport Commissioner, Chief Ports officer, Marine Engineer and Hydeographer are merged in the office of the Board.

#### 6. Objectives of Maharashtra Maritime Board

- Carryout graph survey and make graph & other survey/ investigations of the Creeks within the area of Maharashtra Maritime Board in the adjoining of minor port areas and rivers in the Konkan Division.
- Provision of facilities for easy navigation.
- Undertake preventive measures of the giving protection to the lives & properties of the people living near seashore caused due to Erosion of seashore due to the waves of sea.
- Emphasize upon increasing the Revenue of the Division.
- Prevention of illegal navigation & excersize proper Control on it.
- Utilize fully the advantage of natural Ports of Maharashtra
   State.
- Maintain the service efficiency to encourage the water passenger transportation system and reduce the pressure on roads & railway transportation
- Provision of efficient service.
- Take the cognizance of the public complaints & take redressal measures to settle the complaints & maintain courteous relations with the public.
- Observation of the time limit prescribed for issue of certificates/ licenses/ No objection certificates related to the Department and assure the public that these will be issued within time limit.

 The officers of Department will be polite, courteous & resolute and will remain present in uniform in time and with identity cards.

- Issue of licenses to passenger Boats for public transportation.
- Permission to be granted for shooting of the films within Port area.
- Permission to be granted to hold swimming competition.
- Preventive measure for sea erosion to be under taken.
- Framing the Navigation Regulations.
- Render Pilotage required by certain ports.
- Carryout survey under Inland vessels Act 1917 and issue survey certificates.
- Permission to be granted for installation of fishing Stacks and fishing Nets.

#### 8. Registration of the boats under Inland Vessels, Act 1917.

The Government under Inland Vessels Act 1917 has issued notification No: 08/2000/CR- 134/ Part- 2/PRT- 1 dated 15/06/2001 for registration of boats in the state and declared the place of registration at Mumbai, Thane, Murud-Janjira, Ratnagiri & Vengurla Maharashtra Maritime Board Port office of Bandra, Mora, Rajpuri (Murud-Janjira), Ratnagiri & Vengurla Port Office as Registration officers.

#### 12.Infrastructure facilities for Ports

It includes 1) Greenbelt twelve monthly Ports 2)
Self controlled Jetties 3) Multipurpose Jetties 4)
Jetties of four kinds are under jurisdiction of Maharashtra
Maritime Board. Also includes development of internal water
way transport system.

#### (1) Policy for Twelve monthly Green Belt development:-

In view of the Industrial Development undertaken in Konkan Coastal line maximum facilities is required to be provided by the Government; therefore the Government has fixed the policy for development of 48 ports on Konkan coastal line by involving private sector. (Government Resolutions dated 15/3/1996, 28/11/2000 & 24/4/2002)

- Build, own, use, participate & Transfer, on this principle the concession has been granted for the period of 50 years.
- In the development of Ports the Government owns equity share up to 11%.
- Appointment of Two Directors from Maharashtra
   Maritime Board on the Board of Directors of the Company.
- Exemption from the payment of the registration fees
   & stamps duties on concession agreement.

- Recovering of Jetty rent at concessional rate.
- The part of the funds to be provided by Maharashtra Maritime Board/ State Government for connecting Road to the nearest National Highway.
- Full liberty to fix fees/ rates for provision of the services at the port.

#### (2) Policy for development of the self controlled Ports

For the construction work of minor ports based on Industries and facilities available the policy of Maharashtra Maritime Board/ Government is as below: (G.R. Dated 26/6/1995, 19/8/2005, 23/11/2005)

- Construction work under the principles of Build, Operate and Transfer.
- The period of the agreement with Maharashtra Maritime Board will be of 30 years.
- The Jetty fees will not be recovered from the Ships called by the State Government at the place of port. However the loading and unloading fees will be recovered from the concerned ships at the rate notified the Government/ Maharashtra Maritime Board.
- This ports permitted under the principles of Build, Operate and Transfer in these case after expiry of the period, this Jetty & additional construction work will be returned to Government.

#### (3) Policy regarding construction work of the Multipurpose

#### **Terminal**

In comparison to any one greenbelt port or self controlled Jetty where the investment is less and having the necessary gestation period, then policy in case of such multipurpose terminal has been issued vide Government Resolution dated 19/8/2005. The main policy Characteristics of this policy are as below:

- Development under the principles of Build, Operate, Own & Transfer.
- Agreement for 30 years.
  - The loading & unloading Charges to be recovered will be at one & half times of the charges rates that will be fixed by Government/ Maharashtra Maritime Board from time to time for the specific self controlled Jetties.
  - It will be full responsibility of the developer to provide infra structure including scooping of the silt from water way & provisions of resources for navigation.

#### (4) Policy of Jetties of Maharashtra Maritime Board

In the Jetties owned by Maharashtra Maritime Board if the Industrial Company expresses interest in handling of the goods. Then the proposal of the company after consideration and mutual understanding between Industrial Company executes agreement which includes the terms & conditions. The fees for handling goods is charged as notified by Government /Maharashtra Maritime Board.

# (5) Development of water transportation under centrally Sponsored Scheme.

Throughout Maharashtra there are Creeks, Rivers, Tanks and Canal available for internal water transportation. In the country for motivation of internal water transportation of the coastal States 90% (percent) financial Assistance is provided from the Central Government under Centrally Sponsored Scheme. For Maharashtra State during the year 2003-04 & 2004-05 the following Eight projects are sanctioned under the Centrally sponsored Scheme.

- 1. In Godavari river Vishnupuri, District Nanded.
- From South Mumbai in Amba river/ Dharmatar Creek, Mandava.
- 3. From South Mumbai in Amba river/ Dharmatar Creek, Kharanja.
- 4. In Mhasla/ Mandad river (Rajpuri Creek) Rajpuri.
- 5. In Mhasla/ Mandad river (Rajpuri Creek) Dhighi.
- 6. In Mhasla/ Mandad river (Rajpuri Creek) Janjira Fort.
- 7. In Mhasla/ Mandad river (Rajpuri Creek) Agardhanda
- 8. Issapur District Nanded.

Under Water Transport network, Bandra, Juhu & Varsova are included in Western coastal water way in the proposed water way from Nariman Point to Borivali.

- Nariman Point (Near NCPA), other places of Bandra Juhu Chawpatty, Varsova, Arangal, Marve and Borivali will be considered.
- For this purpose Maharashtra State Road Development corporation has been appointed as an Implementing Agency.
- Eastern Coastal Water Way and Cross Harbor way, these other two Water ways have been established as Commuter Ferry organization. However for modernization as Global organization improvement in the infrastructure etc the details are being worked are.

• For development of Eastern Coastal line Water way even the S.P.V. has been registered.

#### Other Facilities:-

Incentive for Systematic utilization of the seashore for various other programmes a residual Policy has been framed for providing Facilities to different Categories of programmes.

- Water Sports, Sea Museum, Aquarium, Sea Parks etc recreation programmes.
- Water Transport for tourists & Sportsmen.
- Access into Private residential abode.
- Marine Education and Research.

#### **Main Policy Characteristics**

- Categorization is to be made in the interest of private and public sectors and fixation of separate. Distribution/ Development under guideline principles for categorized Development.
- For all categories the lease should be for maximum period of 10 years.
- Non-refundable nominal license fee to be paid only once & the fixation of rate of lease land rent to be paid.
- After payment of the admissible license fees then transfer of lease hold right will be proper.
- Acceptance of flexible structure preferred.
- For certification of the actual Composition of planned structure and Development by entry into panel of Maharashtra Maritime Board.
- For Government / Semi Government Organization
   Concession of 50% in the fees. After expiry of lease of 10
   years the interest of Immovable property will be invested in
   Maharashtra Maritime Board.
- First right of priority redistribution and refusal to discharge necessary obligation.

#### **Survey for Water Graphing**

Under the Hydrographer in Maharashtra Maritime Board a Hydrographer Department is functioning. This department provides the planning of different departments and development of the sea projects and information of implementations. Further under the regulation of Sea Shore area, the measures for safely navigation and development of the ports and survey work of drawing line of highest/lowest tide is undertaken. This department has got collection of more than 938 information maps in the department. Those, with an interest to utilize water way for them these maps are made available by payment of prescribed fees.

Further from the Hydrographer Department the tables of low tide of minor ports are published. In this table the timings of high tide/low tide and the approximated height of the waves are given.

# Marine Engineer & Chief Surveyor : Silt Excavation Navigation Inland Vessels Act, 1917:

Excavation of the Silt: - In the water way due to natural process the silt is collected which does not make required depth available for navigation. Therefore for excavation of the silt in these places and make available required depth for water transport of passenger & goods a dredging unit with employees are functioning in the office of the Marine Engineer. The work of silt excavation is carried out in the required area as per sanctioned programme during open season from 15<sup>th</sup> September to 25<sup>th</sup> May every year and from the year 1999 a separate capital dredging fund has been made available, after completion of Tender process the silt excavation at a

large scale through the private Contractors is undertaken and the target of silt excavation is achieved by office of the Marine Engineer.

<u>Navigation Facilities</u>: Internally from Dahanu to Kiranpani, on this Coastal line Fishermen for Navigation and for Boat Navigation guidance 45 Navigation light are installed. The Navigation lights were being operated on Gas & electricity earlier but now the work to fix the Solar Lamps, working on Solar Energy are completed.

<u>Inland Vessels Act 1917</u>: from May 2000 under the Inland Vessels Act 1917 the work of annual inspection of the boats registered in Maharashtra has been allotted to the Marine Engineer & the work of inspection of about 750 boats is being carried out & the work of issue of certificate is undertaken by the Marine Engineer.

Civil Engineering Works undertaken by Maharashtra Maritime

Board.

Due to forceful stormy waves on certain place on Coastal line of Maharashtra, erosion is caused in seashore and causes dangers to nearby residential areas. In the Erosion Prone area for prevention of erosion, decision has been taken to construct the erosion preventive dams after survey of the spots and plans & estimates of these dams are prepared by Coastal Engineer and Administrative Approval is granted & after the funds are made available by Government the works are undertaken & completed. The places which are proper for water transportation in that place passenger shelter and water supply arrangement are being made. Further for securely the water transportation lamps etc facilities are provided in the ports.
